# Review of CIMS

- This review covers 12 months of 2011
- Review of three areas of CIMS use:
  - On-Hours Incidents Reviewed (10pm-6am)
  - Overrides of the System
  - Incidents Missed During Off-Hours
- Policy/Procedure



# On-Hours Incidents Reviewed

- There were 22 requests for a review of camera footage from the on-hours (10pm – 6am)
- The footage was reviewed and recordings were made in twelve requests.
  - Footage was provided to:
    - Traffic Captain (1)
    - Detective Sergeant (1)
    - Evidence (10)
  - Recordings were not made in ten requests due to:
    - Nothing of value being visible on the footage (6)
    - Camera being out of service (2)
    - Public request for footage that is evidence in a case (turned over to DA) and cannot be released (1)
    - Past retention period (1)

# Types of incidents that the footage was reviewed/requested for:

- Fire Box Pull/Alarm
- Graffiti
- Larceny
- Malicious Damage (2)
- Motor Vehicle Crash (3)
- Motor Vehicle Pursuit

- Public Records Request
- Receiving Stolen Property
- Robbery (2)
- Shooting



# System Overrides

- During 2011, there were 53 overrides of the camera system (turning the camera on during the off-hours of 6am-10pm).
- Overrides were initiated by:
  - Commanding Officer (2)
  - Dispatchers (19)
  - BPD IT Director (32)



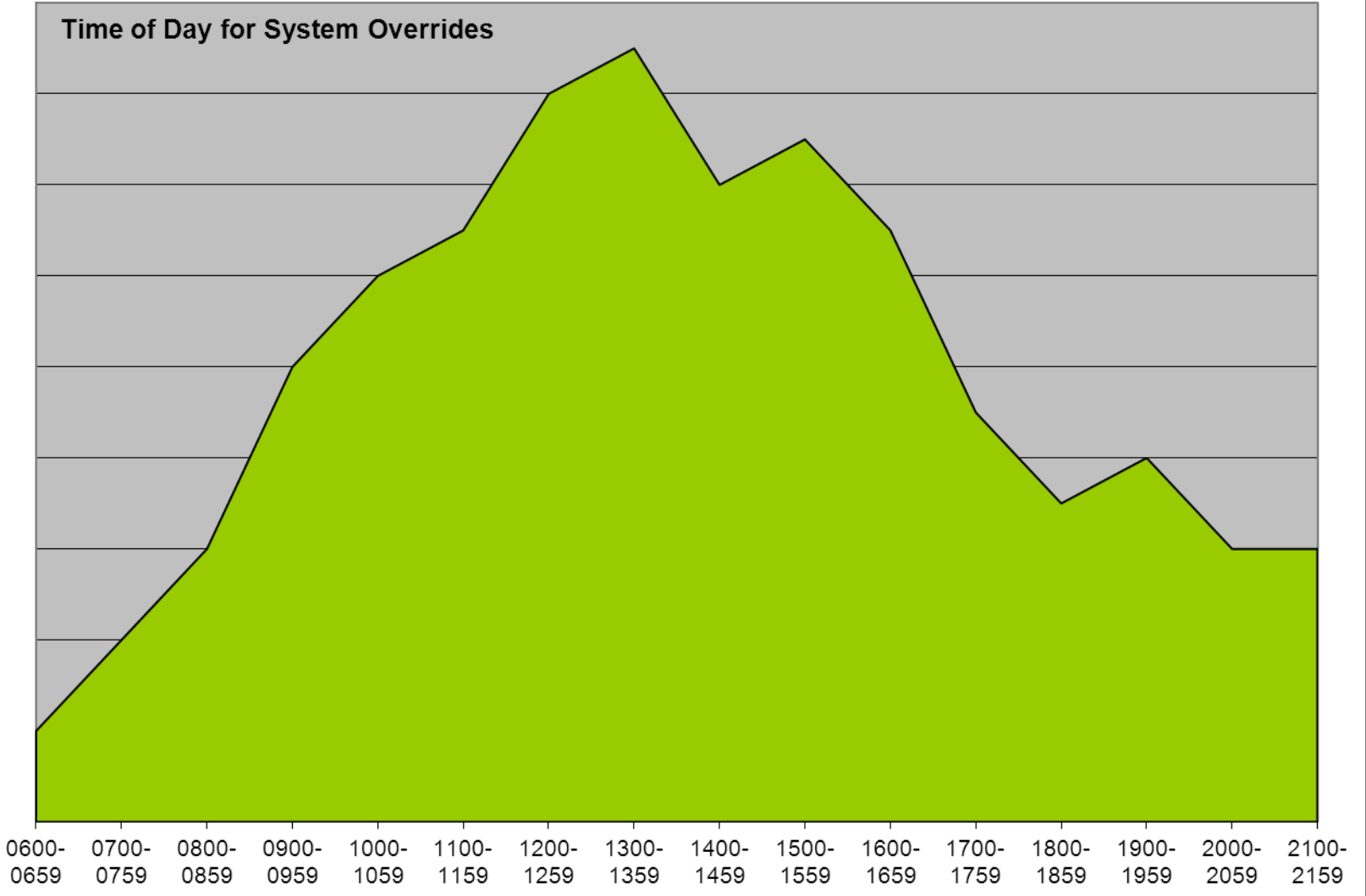

# Incidents Missed

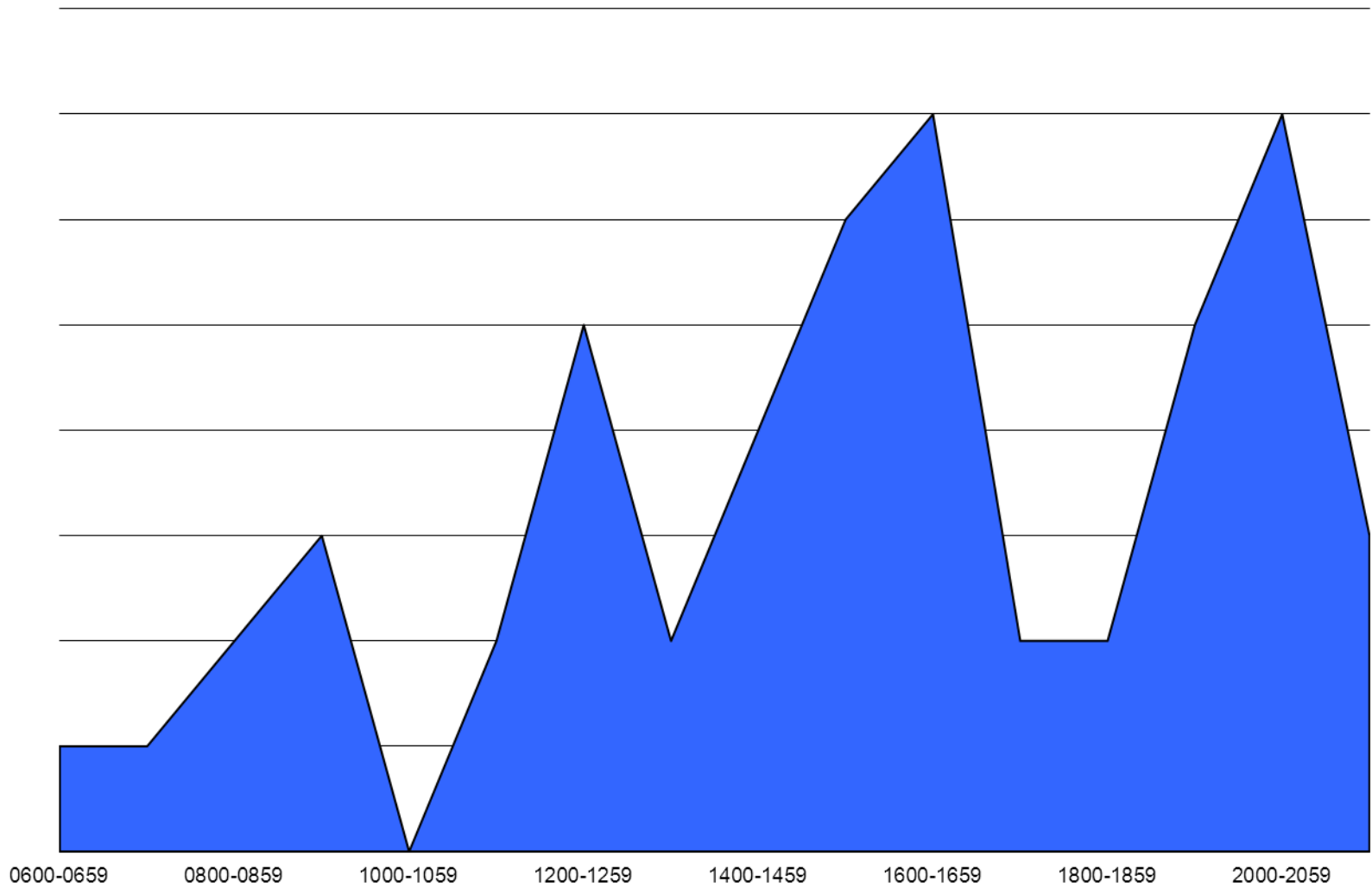
- The following is a look at incidents for which it is believed valuable footage could have been obtained had the cameras been on.
